Dissolving the fibers of the hybrid mulberry tree, or "kozo", smoothing it out flat, and drying it is the process called "kamisuki," or Japanese papermaking. Through this program, by using a towel to smooth out the fibers and COPYING the fabric of the towel, participants can easily make original Japanese paper. Using the paper they've made, they can enclose an LED candle and make a mini-LED Japanese paper candle. Participants can make their own one-of-a-kind candle.

A new, simplified version of a process most believe requires a craftsman, "towel papermaking" enables participants to make Japanese paper and then use that technique to create a mini-candle. A creative experience program covering everything from the process to applications.



## 【Notes】

- ※Additional charge of 6,000 yen/person if over 10 participants (max 25)
  - ※Payment required in advance.
  - ※Price includes cost of materials.
  - ※Participants can take home their creations
  - ※Items to bring: Towel to wipe hands
  - ※Clothing:
    - Comfortable clothing
    - Clothing that can handle moisture, or an apron
- «Special characteristics of the mini-LED Japanese paper candle»
- Cordless / battery-powered
  - illumination resembles that of candle
  - can turn on/off with a soft breath
  - H 12cm, diameter 7cm
- ※Transportation fee to be borne by participants.

## 【Schedule (sample)】

- [1]Instructor guidance (approx. 10 min.)
- [2]Based on instructor guidance, experience papermaking (approx. 50 min.)
  - First participants make 3 sheets using towels. They take home and dry there (takes 4-5 days).
  - Then participants are given paper that's already been properly dried, remove paper from towel, and use to create mini-LED Japanese paper candle.
